

Koba closes his eyes and starts counting while the others scramble to find a good hiding place.




When Koba reaches ten, he shouts,

Kiduchu gets a fright!


Kiduchu is surprised that Koba was able to find her so quickly. “You didn’t close your eyes properly!” she tells him.


Kibena

Kibena, Kiduchu and Koba continue searching.





“Baraka sure knows how to hide,” says Kiduchu.

Baraka is hiding near the cave!


When he hears Kibena, Koba and Kiduchu above him, he heads into the cave.

“Wait for meeee!”




He explains that he stepped on something in the cave, and they all decide to go back into the cave and check it out.




They meet Bundi coming out of the cave! They are about to run off when Bundi says, “Don’t be scared.”

Kibena, Baraka and Koba gather together, and Bundi flies over, laughing because he had found them so fast.





“Only Kiduchu is left,” says Kibena.
“She’s probably hiding inside.”
They all go off to find Kiduchu.



Bundi flies around and around, but there is no sign of Kiduchu. “She’s not anywhere outside,” Bundi says.



The three children go into Mzee Kigo's house to look for her...



but come running out quickly.
“It’s too dark to see anything!” says Baraka.



When Bundi goes inside, with his owl vision,
he sees Kiduchu straight away!
“Seen you, Kiduchu!” he shouts.



When Bundi comes out,
followed by Kiduchu,
the others are surprised.

“How did you find Kiduchu
so quickly in the dark?” Koba asks.



But Bundi flies off without answering them.



The children look at each other
and try to figure out the answer.





It's not because Bundi can fly,
because he found Kiduchu inside.



It's not because he can hear well,
because Baraka was very quiet.



It's not because their shadows gave them away,
because there are no shadows in the dark.



Just then, Mzee Kigo walks up, carrying his torch.
“Maybe Bundi’s eyes are like a torch!”

Mzee Kigo gives them his torch so they can
search for Bundi.




Kibena holds the torch as they walk along the path. In the middle of the path they see Komba the bushbaby, whose giant eyes are looking straight into the torch.

who looks up in surprise.
“Gotcha!” the kids cry out.



Bundi tells them that they have discovered his secret: he can see in the dark.



Bundi asks them how they figured out his secret.
“We used our UBONGOS!” Kibena says.



“We thought of all the things that could have given you an advantage in our game of hide-and-seek.”



Bundi congratulates the kids
on using their UBONGOS and flies off.



The kids decide to try to move in the dark like Komba and Bundi. They give the torch to Komba, who switches it off.



Everything is black. The kids start to run, but soon Komba hears them crying out, “Ouch!” and “Oww!” and “Mama!”




Komba turns on the torch and the kids all see each other, one on top of the other, in a pile by a log.
