WHAT IS IT?



Wo Long: Fallen Dynasty is an action role-playing video game developed by Team Ninja and published by Koei Tecmo. It is set during the Three Kingdoms period of China, and it features a blend of historical and mythological elements. The game was released for Microsoft Windows, PlayStation 4, PlayStation 5, Xbox One, and Xbox Series X/S in March 2023.



In Wo Long: Fallen Dynasty, players take control of a nameless soldier who must fight for survival in a world ravaged by war and demons. The game features a real-time combat system that combines elements of hack-and-slash and turn-based strategy. Players will need to use a variety of weapons and abilities to defeat their enemies, as well as manage their stamina and health.

BREAKDOWN THE BASICS



Wo Long features a complex mixture of mechanics that forces players to stay on top of their game. Players will need to use a variety of weapons and abilities to defeat their enemies, and they will also need to manage their stamina and health. Players will have their skills and patience tested, however, it is also a rewarding game that offers a unique and exciting experience.

Mechanics



Combat

In Wo Long's combat, achieving success requires a combination of precision and patience. Enemies can block or evade most of your attacks, leaving you with only a small window of opportunity to inflict damage.

There are two main types of attacks. Normal Attacks are swift and allow for consecutive strikes to create powerful combos. On the other hand, Spirit Attacks are slower but deliver greater damage while simultaneously reducing the enemy's Spirit Gauge. However, these attacks also deplete your own Spirit reserves.

Martial Arts techniques are special maneuvers that deplete your Spirit Gauge but have the advantage of bypassing an opponent's guard. Executing Martial Arts strikes can be challenging, requiring precise timing and positioning. Each weapon type possesses its own set of Martial Arts techniques. If the available options don't align with your preferred combat style, experimenting with different weapons might get you the results you're looking for.

To effectively navigate combat you will need to keep an eye on your Health Bar, Spirit Gauge, and Morale Rank.

The Spirit Gauge serves as your stamina bar, enabling you to perform defensive actions such as blocking and dodging enemy assaults as well as the execution of Spirit Attacks. Sustaining multiple hits will gradually drain your Spirit Gauge.

Morale Rank functions as a level system that directly impacts your combat prowess. A higher rank indicates increased strength. You can raise your Morale Rank by engaging in battles and defeating adversaries. The Morale Rank displayed above enemies' heads indicates their relative power and serves as a gauge of the challenge they pose.



Weapons

Players can equip two Melee Weapons and two Ranged Weapons. Melee Weapons include swords, spears, and hammers designed for close-quarter combat. They are used for both Basic and Spirit Attacks, and you can switch between them seamlessly. Each weapon possesses a unique set of Martial Arts abilities, allowing you to execute special attacks that bypass an enemy's defences.

On the other hand, Ranged Weapons include bows and crossbows. When wielding a Ranged Weapon, a cursor will appear on the screen, enabling you to aim at your target. For maximum effectiveness, aim for the head from a distance to inflict significant damage. However, it is wise to use Ranged Weapons sparingly, as ammunition is limited. Take care to time your shots carefully to make the most of your available arrows.



Armour


There are four pieces of armour you can equip:

- Bracelets
- Chest Armour
- Helmet or Hat
- Footwear

Each armour description provides comprehensive stats, including Defence, Physical Resistance, Spirit Defence, Resistance Graph, Special Effects, and Equipment Weight.

A small helmet icon indicates the weight category. Below the icon, one to three bars indicate the armour's weight, with more bars representing heavier armour. On the other side of the helmet icon, the numerical weight of the armour is displayed. The armour's weight influences defence and physical resistance.

The Defence stat determines the amount of HP lost when attacked, while Physical Resistance affects damage from enemy physical attacks. Spirit Defence determines the loss of Spirit when hit. The Resistance graph illustrates the armour's resistance to elemental damage. Next to the graph, the Five Virtues are listed, with higher numbers indicating stronger defences against specific elemental types.



Virtues

The Five Virtues are elemental and players can learn Wizardry Spells and increase their stats by levelling up each of the Five Virtues.

Wood Virtue

- Main Stats: Spirit defence, Spell duration, Earth defence
- Build Focus: Lightning spells, losing less Spirit on hits

Fire Virtue

- Main Stats: Attack Spirit gain rate, Martial Arts Spirit consumption rate, Metal defence
- Build Focus: Getting more spirit per attack, general aggression and attacking

Earth Virtue

- Main Stats: Deflect Spirit gain rate, Maximum equipment weight, Water Defence
- Build Focus: Deflecting to gain more spirit, wearing studied armour to lower the risk of missing a deflection

Metal Virtue

- Main Stats: Spirit sustainability, Wizardry Spell Spirit consumption, Wood defence
- Build Focus: Keep your positive Spirit for longer, and reduce the Spirit cost of spells

Water Virtue

- Main Stats: Ranged attack power, Stealth detection, Deflection Spirit consumption rate, Fire defence
- Build Focus: Using bows to score criticals, deflecting to gain more Spirit per deflect

The map of Wo Long: Fallen Dynasty is a large open world that players can explore. The map includes a variety of locations, including:


- The Wei Kingdom is one of the three kingdoms that are vying for control of China. It is ruled by the ruthless warlord Cao Cao.

TIPS & TRICKS



Revenge is best

When you are defeated, your Morale Rank goes down and you lose half of your Genuine Qi. But don't worry! You can regain the lost Genuine Qi and Morale by defeating the enemy who took you down. Just be careful not to kick the bucket again before getting them back, or they'll be gone for good.

Defence is the best offence

Deflecting attacks is the key to combat in Wo Long. It lets you stay on the offensive, dodging blows, and unleashing counterattacks without skipping a beat. You can deflect any attack, even the ones you least expect, as long as you time it right.

Don't sweat the mini-bosses

There are optional tough mini-bosses that you might stumble upon while exploring. When you come across them, they'll probably be way stronger than your current morale level. But don't fret! You can come back to them later in the mission, once you've got a better damage boost. Then, you can take them down and snatch the treasure they're guarding.
